### **E. The Expectations of Adoptors:**

- Be responsible to transport your adopted animal within one week of the completion and approval of the adoption contract, approval of the site visit, and payment clearance
- Bring 1-2 bales of hay to trade with ours in order to mix old with the new for the adopted horse
- Bring your own halter and lead rope
- Feed your horse a minimum of 2x/day, and access to fresh water all day every day
- Free access to salt/mineral block or equivalent
- Feed supplements (beet pulp, appropriate grain mixes, etc.) daily as needed to maintain ideal weight and/or overall health
- Regular de-worming, hoof trimming, routine veterinary care, teeth maintenance, and immunizations
- Have an on-site visit from a JACR representative to inspect the premises, conditions of fences, etc. prior to adoption approval
- Have an unannounced site visit from a JACR representative 1-3x at the discretion of JACR during the first two years of adoption
- Be responsible to contact us if your contact information changes, the horse is moved to another location, becomes very sick, or dies anytime within the first two years of adoption
- Have humane treatment of the horse at all times, no harsh training methods
- Agree to not sell the adopted animal for two years from the date of the adoption contract being signed by both you and a qualified JACR representative
- Agree to return the animal to JACR, at your expense, if the horse does not work out for you or if at any point in the first two years that you are unable to properly care for the well-being of the animal

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Please note: the above bulleted list is not the adoption contract, nor is it a complete list of the adoption requirements. It is simply an outline detailing many of the main requirements to care for a horse well. We strongly urge you to take stock of your finances before you adopt from us to insure you will be able to afford properly taking care of this animal.

Please see our adoption contract for all details of the agreement involved in adopting.

In most cases, the adoption fees go to partially refund what we have already invested in the horse you are adopting. In the case of many rescues, the adoption fee is only a small part of the financial investment we have already made. Because of this, the adoption fees are non-refundable. The exception to this is also outlined in our adoption contract.
